**David Breuhan**  
"Plato to NATO: Where We Are and How We Got There."



David R. Breuhan is Vice President and Portfolio Manager with Schwartz & Co. in Bloomfield Hills, Michigan. For the past 27 years, he has managed retirement plans and individual accounts for high net worth clients.

Following completion of Airborne and Ranger training, he led soldiers as an officer in the United States Army. As a

Captain, David served as a Troop Commander in the Third Armored Cavalry Regiment in Operation Desert Storm. He taught graduate school for 13 years at Walsh College. He has published in The Wall Street Journal, The New York Times, Barron's, and The Catholic Journal.

David has lectured at West Point, Georgetown University and Hillsdale College. He has appeared on Neil Cavuto, National Public Radio and Bloomberg Radio. He has briefed the Vice President, Members of Congress and the United States International Trade Commission. His book is entitled, *Spread The Wealth: More Haves Fewer Have-Nots*.

Harry C. Veryser is an adjunct professor at the University of Detroit Mercy, and in addition teaches at Macomb Community College.

Mr. Veryser received his undergraduate degree in Philosophy and Economics and two Master of Arts degrees in Economics and Religious Studies

from the University of Detroit. He held the rank of Associate Professor of Economics and Finance at Walsh College. Mr. Veryser also served as assistant to the president at Hillsdale College from 1974-78.

Mr. Veryser is currently on the advisory boards of The Mackinac Center for Public Policy in Midland, Michigan and the Acton Institute for the Study of Religion and Liberty in Grand Rapids, Michigan. He was recently appointed an associate scholar to the Ludwig von Mises Institute.

He is the author of *Our Economic Crisis: Sources and Solutions*. His latest book, *It Did Not Have to Be This Way: How the Principles of Austrian Economics lead to Peace and Prosperity*, has been published by ISI books in 2012.
